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Balikumbat Council Votes Accounts

Balikumbat Council had a session which held on the 3rd of April 2017 at the Council hall. The session was devoted to the deliberation and adoption of the 2016 Administrative, Management and Stores account. This was also in a special way devoted to the launching of the update of the Council Development Plan (CDP). Presided at by the Senior Divisional Officer for Ngoketunjia Division Mr. Kuela Valery Norbert, he welcomed everyone and encouraged them to take the CDP update serious. It was attended by a cross section of Divisional Delegates, elected representatives, traditional rulers, Councillors, Sub Divisional Service heads and Council staff. The Administrative and Management Account of 2016 that was adopted stood at Five hundred and forty seven

million.

Fifty four thousand, three hundred and ninety nine (547.054.399) Frs. In the course of the session, chairpersons of the various committees gave their analyses.

The chairperson of the education committee praised the council executive for the recruiting thirty nine (39) teachers who were posted to some needy schools. The committee appealed for the recruitment of a backup staff to be posted to the Inspectorate of Basic Education Balikumbat. Also, they appealed for the rehabilitation of the play ground of some schools and classrooms. They stressed on the need for capacity building seminars for

Councillors.

The Social committee appreciated the Council executive members for the ongoing construction of market toilets in some markets and requested that effective control should be made in order to ensure that they are properly used. The committee recommended that fines should be levied on sellers of food stuffs in exposed containers. it also noted that some public stand taps within the municipality were without water and requested the Council to rehabilitate them and levy fines on those who keep tampering with the stand taps and catchment areas. The committee advised the public to confine their domestic animals during the farming season to guarantee food self-sufficiency.

INVESTMENT

The effectiveness of the council internal tender's board which has develpments as its motor, balikumbat council has been abale to realise and has cntinue to realise several projects. Thanks to this body, the cuncil and its authorities have carried several projects steaming from education, road construction and mainatainance, prviin of scial amaenities and gneral sanitation.

This has seen the construction of an agricultural warehouse in Balikumbat worth 20.000.000frs,

the construction of two classrooms at G.S Ekwo Mbashie in Bafanji worth 18.000.000frs. Within this framework Balikumbat Council had its road maintenance credit from the Ministry of Public Works worth 27.000.000frs. There has equally been the opening of a road linking the agricultural zone of Aghebli Bamunkumbit worth 10.000.000frs. This period also witnessed the construction of road linking Baligashu and Mile Zero in Bafanji. It should be noted that the



building of an embankment on the bridge along this road and the backfilling of the bridge was done with part of the road maintenance credit.

Worth noting is the fact that these projects have all been awarded by the Balikumbat Council Internal Tender's Board and while others have been completely executed others are still ongoing. With the Council local

Council Resolves To Make Available Portable Drinking Water For All

Balikumbat council has taken a commitment to make the precious liquid readily available and accessible to all. To achieve this great developmental goal, the council has been holding several meetings with stake holders to find a lasting solution to the problem of ater scarcity in the municipality.

One of such meetings held on the 21th of July 2017 at 10:00 am at the Council hall during hich the Mayor appreciated the efforts of the sectorial ministries as far as the realization of government projects are concern. he challenged all to put hands on deck to ensure that the vision of the council in this direction is achieved.

For his part, the Divisional Delegate of Water and Energy for Ngoketunjia said the last time they visited the projects sites, they made some observations and that they are still to visit and uplift the reserves. He raised some worries amongst them, problems of sand collapsing and rocks and the insufficient dept of bore holes. The Delegate gave the various dimensions of the bore holes and called for the strick respect of this prescription..

He added that pumping test has been carried out on the borehole at Munanji and was seen to be satisfactory. He gave the official



pumping test as 700liters per hour.

The contractor of SAK Enterprise took the floor to address to some of the difficulties which were observed on the various projects sites. He talked of the collapse of sand which was the major difficulty and cited an example as they drill 15 meters and the next day, it is seen that sand has collapse and fill up to 8 meters. He said instead of starting from the fifteen meters, it starts at 8 meters and that the issue of black stones was also a hindrance to bore holes projects execution.

Alluding to the problem, the Divisional Delegate of Public Contracts explained that the government is out to pay the volume of work done. He cited an example that, should a contract be issued on building construction and in the process of implementation the structure collapses, it must be reconstructed before the contract is paid. He said that they are not out to kill the contractors but to ensure that what the government allocates for the purpose is realized effectively for the benefit of the population.

Several recommendations emerged from the meeting amongst which was That the 1st of August 2017, was to be the deadline for ROYAL ENTERPRISE and MAF CONSTRUCTION to submit their signed contract. And that failure to do sanctions ould be metted on them.

The SIM-BA accounting software has been introduced in the Balikumbat Council. It is an accounting soft ware that helps in the keeping of accounts. Makes work easy to submit monthly reports to the regional treasurers and council report at the audit bench of the Supreme Court. Because it's still in French, it has necessitated quarterly update training of seminars to better equip its users, mayor,

municipal treasurers and council finance officers. Updated trainings organized have been fruitful, evident in the last performance bread basket results which showed remarkable improvements in the council.



Joguru And Bafanji Leave Darkes At Last!

Joguru in Balikumbat to Njanung in Bafanji can now boost of electricity. The electricity extension to these municipalities was principally financed by the National Community Driven Development Program. The extension of electricity with capacity of 25KW in these villages falls under Article 10 (II (2) that is economic infrastructure. Before this, villages use to use only bush lamps t light up their home especially at night, had little social life especially in the evenings except for a richer minority that could afford for small generators to illuminate their various homes. With the project now a reality, life has been planted as there has been a new fund way of life as farmers and inhabitants can now sit back and



watch television with family at night, socialise with friends at socialising joints and business has been triggered with cold stores, bars and other electricity business friendly activities have emerged in these villages.
